Since technical analyses to support the Tier 1 EIS are ongoing now, study outcomes are not yet available. Additional information will be included in the Draft Tier 1 EIS, which will be available for public review. The primary objective of these meetings was to collect additional information on the community's key issues and concerns, which will be considered in the Draft Tier 1 EIS analysis.
Are you going to listen to us?	Yes: FHWA and ADOT participated in all of the stakeholder engagement meetings in order to hear firsthand the community's concerns. The primary objective of these meetings was to collect additional information on the community's key issues and concerns, which will be considered in the EIS analysis. The final report prepared by USIECR has been made available to the general public and the entire study team on the project webpage. The report, which contains all participant comments expressed at the six stakeholder engagement meetings, will be used to inform the Draft Tier 1 EIS analysis and will be included as part of the Draft Tier 1 EIS documentation.

How does that proposed commuter rail system between Phoenix-Tucson get considered in weighing either option?	A Selected Corridor for intercity passenger rail from Tucson to Phoenix was identified by the Federal Railroad Administration and ADOT in 2016. The I-11 Draft Tier 1 EIS will not reconsider the passenger rail study outcomes. The potential for incorporating other transportation modes (such as passenger rail) into the I-11 Corridor was considered during the prior <i>I-11 and Intermountain West Corridor Study</i> and the scoping and alternatives development process. Non-programmed modal alternatives such as passenger rail were not carried forward into the Tier 1 EIS analysis. The Tier 1 EIS will consider space within the analysis area that could be utilized for rail or utility co-location if this infrastructure is to be further studied, programmed and/or implemented in the future. Currently, there is no funding identified in any state or local improvement plans to advance further studies and construction of the rail project. The funding decision will be up to the public and policymakers.
<ul> <li>Is there a specific road that is being studied for Option C? Sandario was suggested several times but never confirmed as the exact option.</li> </ul>	Options C and D both run between Sandario Road and the Tucson Mitigation Corridor. Sandario Road is an important local transportation facility and would be retained as a local facility if Options C or D is recommended. Previous studies identified key transportation-related problems and issues in the I- 11 Corridor Study Area, which have been refined through agency coordination and public involvement during scoping. The assessment of needs builds upon the Planning and Environmental Linkages documentation prepared as part of previous studies. The problems, issues, and opportunities in the I-11 Corridor Study Area are:  • Population and employment growth • Congestion and travel time reliability • System linkages and regional and interstate mobility • Access to economic activity centers • Homeland security and national defense.

A Recommended Alternative will be provided in the Draft Tier 1 EIS and will be subject to public review and comments. Following consideration and response to input received during the public review period, an agency Preferred Alternative will be identified in the Final Tier 1 EIS. Following a public review period on the Final Tier 1 EIS, an FHWA decision and Selected Alternative will be documented in the Record of Decision which is not expected until late 2019, at the earliest. Funding for Tier 2 studies, design, and construction of high-priority segments is not identified in any part of the study area at this time.
